
"It draws me closer to Jesus with His visual presence in the Eucharist."

We must be responsible for our choices.

In today's first reading, Adam says he only ate the fruit because Eve gave it to him. Eve says the serpent tricked her. Neither takes responsibility. How often do we play the blame game? Jesus always took responsibility for His actions. In this weekend's gospel, he returns to His childhood home town after being on the road with His ministry. Even when His neighbors question him, Jesus stands firm. He knows His mission and cannot be swayed from His responsibilities.

We make choices every day that affect us.

Some of the choices are insignificant and some will affect us for our entire lives – and the lives of others – dramatically. We will make some very good choices; we will make some very poor choices. But it is our moral and Christian obligation to accept the responsibility of those choices. With God's help, we can stand firmly in our goodness when others try to sway us.

When we err, we must repent and seeks God's healing forgiveness in the sacrament of Confession. There is no room for the blame game. The choice is ours. The responsibility is ours.


