Mass of the Lord's Supper

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

The Easter Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year.

Through the liturgy of the Triduum, the Church is intimately united with Christ and shares in his passage from death to life. The Mass of the Lord's Supper is fittingly the first liturgical action of the Easter Triduum. Tonight is the night we follow the example of our Lord as we wash the feet of His followers.

Following the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Faithful are invited to continue adoration before the Blessed Sacrament in the Garden set up in the Holy Family Hall

The Christian faithful gather to recall devoutly the death of the Lord

This Service includes:

- ◇ *Liturgy of the Word*
- ◇ *Veneration of the Cross*
- ◇ *Holy Communion*

There are three methods of veneration: a profound bow, genuflection, or kissing of the corpus/cross.

This is the one day out of the year, that Jesus is not present in the tabernacle. Therefore, when we come into the church, we do not genuflect.

Just a Reminder: Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. We don't eat between meals, and the 3 meals combined should be no bigger than one large meal. It is also a day of abstaining from meat.

Holy Saturday

April 15th - 8:30 PM

(no 5 p.m. Mass)

Easter Vigil - This Mass is the greatest and most noble of all solemnities

There is to only be one celebration in each church on this night and it is arranged in such a way that after the Blessing of the Fire and Easter Proclamation (which constitutes the first part of this Vigil), Holy Church meditates on the wonders the Lord God as done for His people from the beginning, trusting in His word and promise (the second part, that is, the liturgy of the Word) until, as day approaches, with new members reborn in Baptism (the third part), the Church is called to the table the Lord as prepared for His people, the memorial of His Death and Resurrection until He comes again (the fourth part).

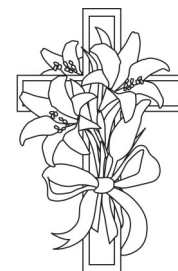

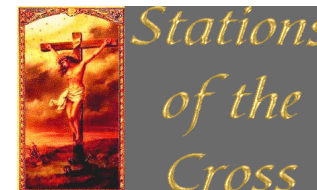
Stations of the Cross
