During November, we remember and pray for the deceased as we remember all souls. We will be hanging a banner of all those who have died between October 15th, 2016 to October 15th, 2017. We will also have our Book of the Deceased (by the baptismal font) for you to inscribe names of your family, friends, and neighbors who have died. These names will be remembered at every Mass at St. Philip Neri during November. This year we will be adding lighted candles with pictures of the deceased who have died during this past year from our parish at all weekend Masses in front of the altar. These can be taken home by The Family of the deceased at the end of November. If any family would like additional candles, they will be sold for \$5 per candle, and they can be ordered in the office.

All Saints Day Holy Day of Obligation

All Soul's Day – Nov. 2nd is a traditional day for praying for those who have died – our ancestors and loved ones. If you wish to have a Mass offered for your deceased friends and/or family on Thursday, you can find an envelope on a table in the entry way. Please put who the Mass intention is for and who it is from on the outside of the envelope. This is the one day of the year that the church allows us to say several collective Mass intentions at one time. If you would like your Mass intention(s) included on Thurs. Nov. 2, please make sure the office has your envelope and information by noon on Thursday. You can also drop it in the All Saints Day Collection. If you have a lot of names and would like to insert a piece of paper into the envelope, you can do so. The Mass will be said at 5 PM Thursday afternoon at St. Philip Neri.

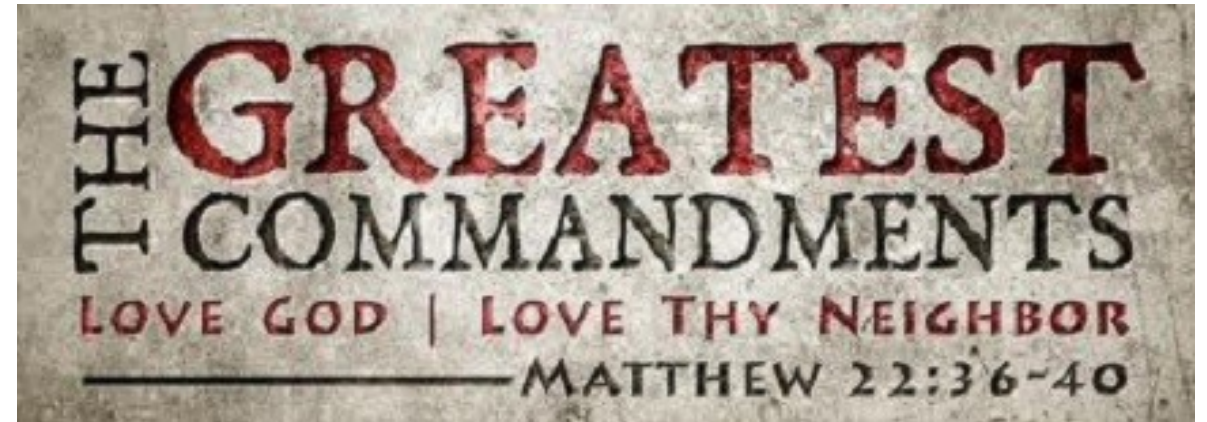
All Souls Day Mass times: **Nov. 2nd** 8:45AM at the Care Center; 5:00 PM at the parish with pilgrimage to cemeteries to follow.

All Soul's Day Procession – We will be holding a special Mass of Remembrance on Thursday Nov. 2nd at 5 PM in the church. All are welcome to attend this Mass as we remember those who have died and passed away. We will read aloud the names of those who have passed away from our parish during this past year as part of this liturgy. We invite you to join us after Mass as we make a pilgrimage to our three cemeteries to pray for our beloved dead. We will gather at St. Anthony's cemetery to pray a Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 6 PM or shortly after. From there, we will journey to St. Boniface to pray a rosary on their new stepping stone rosary for all who have died, and we will gather at St. Philip Neri cemetery in Napoleon to offer a Chaplet of Divine Mercy for those who have died. If you would like to carpool, please meet at the church after Mass.

Remember: On All Souls Day (Nov. 2) there is an opportunity for you to gain a plenary indulgence for those who have died. To gain the indulgence there are 4 criteria:

- 1. Visit the cemetery and pray for the deceased on Nov. 2nd**
- 2. Go to confession**
- 3. Receive Communion at Mass**
- 4. Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, Pope Francis**

Right to Life Bingo will be Sun., Nov., 5th @ 7 PM in HFH.

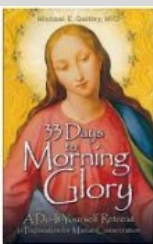

St. Philip Neri Finance Council Condensed Minutes of Oct. 18 Meeting: Fr. discussed presenting to the parish the tax advantages of contributing to an endowment. A solar light has been placed at the St. Anthony Shrine. New soffit and fascia for shrine will be considered. Glatt's term expires in December. Fr. reappointed Schwartzenberger as secretary, and Bitz will be new treasurer. Glatt reported 187 out of 272 (69%) of families have contributed to the God's Gift Campaign for a total of \$64,424 or \$24,329 over the goal of \$40,095.
