Corpus Christi Celebration

Corpus Christi, Latin for the body of Christ, is a Sunday (2 weeks after Pentecost) when we celebrate the tremendous gift of Jesus’ Body and Blood. Corpus Christi was made a universal feast in the 1264, nearly 800 years ago. Traditionally it has been accompanied with an outdoor procession. As a sign of our love we have for Jesus in the Eucharist, especially as it has been enkindled in Eucharistic adoration, I invite you to partake in this great celebration. I had the tremendous experience to be the Corpus Christi Procession in Rome one year where they process from St. John Lateran Basilica to St. Mary Major Basilica. The Sunday morning Mass on June 7th will be immediately followed by a Eucharistic procession around St. Philip Neri Church. We will walk carrying the Blessed Sacrament and sing hymns and demonstrate our faith and love of Jesus in the Eucharist. We would then return for benediction and dismissal. A special thanks to the KC’s who are helping with the procession.

Parish Renewal: Prayer & Study Phase

In virtue of their baptism, all the members of the People of God have become missionary disciples (cf. *Mt* 28:19). All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization, and it would be insufficient to envisage a plan of evangelization to be carried out by professionals while the rest of the faithful would simply be passive recipients. The new evangelization calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptized. Every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelization; indeed, anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love. Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are "disciples" and "missionaries", but rather that we are always "missionary disciples". If we are not convinced, let us look at those first disciples, who, immediately after encountering the gaze of Jesus, went forth to proclaim him joyfully: "We have found the Messiah!" (*Jn* 1:41). The Samaritan woman became a missionary immediately after speaking with Jesus and many Samaritans come to believe in him "because of the woman's testimony" (*Jn* 4:39). #120 from *Evangelii Gaudium* by Pope Francis

Mat 28:16-20 Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. And when they saw him they worshiped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age."

Local buzz:(what is coming up in our prayer & study)

Upon reading *Evangelium Gaudium* one parishioner offered this insight (150) Today too, people prefer to listen to witnesses: they "thirst for authenticity" and "call for evangelizers to speak of a God whom they themselves know and are familiar with, as if they were seeing him"....Give people opportunities to share their stories with others. Whether it be verbal or written communication. As people start relating with another person's story, those stories start becoming OUR parishes' stories and OUR parishes' faith walk. With this brings unity, strength, and hope within the parish life. As people are touched by another's story, share that feedback with the parish so others are aware of how God is touching our parish. It gives a community hope that others are being touched and healed by another's story. (feedback is already happening but no one knows about it—so it can't help others in their faith walk).
